Getting to our venue

The Central Energy Trust Arena is conveniently located close to the heart of the city centre and a short walk from the city's key accommodation providers.



Drive

Accessing Palmy and Manawatū is easy, with multiple options from the main North Island highways.

If you take our suggested scenic routes you'll find that the region provides a spectacular driving experience.

Fly Palmy Airport is a short 6km to our venue, taking approximately 10 minutes by vehicle.



Air

Our airport is only a short 10-minute drive to Palmy's city centre and 15-minute drive to Feilding.

Palmerston North Airport services Air New Zealand and OriginAir with daily direct flights from Auckland, Christchurch, Nelson and Hamilton.

OriginAir has a daily service from Nelson to Palmerston North, Palmerston North to Hamilton and return.

Car parking

There are several car parks located at Central Energy Trust Arena, which are pictured below.

All car parks are free of charge and available on a first-in-first-served basis.

Dependent on what activity is taking place at the complex, some car parks may be closed, or require a car parking pass for access.

Please follow the specific instructions issued by the event organiser in relation to car parking for the event you are attending.



Accessibility

Our venues are mobility friendly. All entrances into our venues are accessibility friendly, with lifts available on multi-level buildings.

Mobility cubicles are available in most bathroom facilities and independent, gender-neutral stalls are available in Arena 1, Fly Palmy Arena and Arena 4 facilities.

Independent, gender-neutral mobility bathroom stalls are available on both the ground floor and the first floor of the venue.

Mobility cubicles are also available in each of the main male and female bathroom facilities on both the ground floor and first floor of the venue.

Limited mobility car parking is available in all main car parks at the complex and are available on a first-in-first-served basis for those with a valid mobility pass.

E-Scooter

Feel like making your short walk even quicker?

There are also three e-scooter providers in Palmy: Beam, Lime and Flamingo.

Remember to be respectful when sharing footpaths and please ensure e-scooters are left in a sensible location that does not impede access to any walking paths, businesses or entrances – you can find details on e-scooter preferred parking points through the operator's app.

The city centre is a low speed zone with a speed limit of 15km/h enforced.

Please note e-scooters are not permitted within Central Energy Trust Arena.



Deliveries

Depending on other venue activity and venue availability, we are happy to accommodate deliveries of exhibitor materials and goods prior to your arrival.

Please liaise directly with the event organiser to make arrangements about this.

Please be aware, if venue staff are required to sign for your delivery the venue is not responsible for missing, undelivered or damaged items.

Please ensure any deliveries are clearly labelled with the venue's address, the event name, stand number (if possible/ applicable) and contact details for the relevant sender/ organisation.

At the conclusion of the event you are required to make arrangements for the collection of any leftover freight immediately after the event. All items for pick-up must be labelled and ready for collection.



Wifi

Free WiFi is available at our venues which is suitable for basic use, such as checking emails.

Please visit the event registration desk or our reception located on the ground floor of the Arena 1 Grandstand building to obtain login details.

If you require a hard-wire connection this must be arranged in conjunction with the event organiser prior to the event to determine if this can be facilitated.



Trade stand displays

Please ensure any displays at your stand do not cause a disturbance to other venue users or create any hazards, such as trips or impeding egress.

Permission must be given from the venue prior to attaching any materials to the walls of the venue or other surfaces.

Permission must also be given from the event organiser before attaching any materials to any panels if these are provided at your trade stand.



Security of items

The venue will be locked and alarmed at the end of each day by our venue staff, unless overnight security has been arranged to be stationed inside the venue.

If your stand contains valuable items, we do encourage taking these with you at the end of each day, if possible.

The venue takes no responsibility for lost, missing or damaged items.

Te Manawa Museum

Te Manawa is a cultural heart of the city that thrives on discovery – entertaining and inspiring people from all walks of life for more than 40 years. It's more than a museum and a gallery – it's a place where concepts and communities come together.

With an engaging program of exhibitions and events, as well as an extensive collection of taonga (treasures).

Te Manawa offers a unique opportunity to experience and participate in the stories of our past, present and future.

National Wildbase Centre

Central Energy Trust Wildbase Recovery is a specialist centre providing shelter and care for native wildlife recovering after treatment at Massey University's Wildbase Hospital.

The centre releases patients back into the wild once they have recovered. There are also resident animals at Wildbase including whio (blue duck), kereru, baby tuatara and red-crowned kakariki.



New Zealand Rugby Museum

The New Zealand Rugby Museum contains New Zealand's biggest and most comprehensive collection of rugby memorabilia and records, including some of the world's rarest rugby artefact's.

You'll be rewarded with a trip back in time exploring the rich history and folklore of the nation's mighty game with an unmasking of it's rugby heroes and legends.



Boutique Shopping

Opposite the front entrance of the front From clothing to art, books to jewellery, you'll find off the-beaten-path shopping spots dotted throughout Palmy and Manawatū.





He Ara Kotahi

Our Manawatū River Framework recognises the importance of awa to the city. The Framework is about enhancing physical connections with the river environment, expressing Rangitāne O Manawatū's connection with the awa, and creating a destination with things to do.

The multi-award-winning project includes Ahimate Reserve, He Ara Kotahi bridge and Urban Eels platform. Ahimate is home to the city's most popular riverside beach, a dog agility park and a fenced enclosure, mountain bike tracks and a natural playground.

On He Ara Kotahi pathway you'll transverse dairy farms, forests, pā sites, a military camp, streams and a river in less than nine kilometres.

Along the walkway, you will find Urban Eels. This award winning project is a hands-on experience that raises awareness of traditional cultural practices and the significant mauri, or lifeforce, of this water.
